Fifth Sunday of Lent March 22, 2015

"Unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat; but if it dies, it produces much fruit." John 12: 20-33

The Parable of the Lotus

The Chinese hold a special reverence for the lotus flower. The lotus grows from roots embedded deep in the mud of a pond. Slowly and tentatively the first tiny flowers push through the muck and the plant grows steadily toward the surface of the water, always striving for the light. And there it finally blossoms. The Chinese see in the lotus a parable of how something pure and clean and beautiful can issue forth from the darkness and the mire. Once it breaks the surface, the lotus flower is transformed. It has arisen through the mud to reveal its true identity in the glory of the light. The lotus is a symbol of how we too can work through our darkest, most painful circumstances to be reborn to something new.

The lotus blossom and the grain of wheat are both parables of hope in the resurrection despite our Good Fridays, of God's enabling us to turn our lives around and up into the light of joy and fulfillment, of the ultimate triumph of light over darkness, of goodness over evil, of life over death. Both the persevering lotus blossom and the broken grain of wheat teach us an important lesson about love - that the risk of continuing on despite the obstacles and of losing some part of ourselves for the sake of someone else is the price of love. But in taking on the hard work of loving as God loves, we experience the transformation of the flower and realize the harvest of the grain - in our willingness to "die" to our fears, to put aside our own needs and wants, to struggle through the darkness and muck, to let our lives be pulled apart, we discover love that can only be of God.

Christ gave His life on the cross in order that new life might come forth; in taking up our own crosses with Christ's selflessness and compassion, we can transform our lives and the lives of those around us in the complete joy of Easter.

Tenebrae Service

Saint Clement Parish will be having a Tenebrae Service on Wednesday, April 1st, at 7 pm in the church.

The service of Tenebrae is based upon the Roman tradition of the service: it is a vigil office of lessons and lights centered around the Passion and Death of Christ. It is a meditation in ritual upon the loving sacrifice of the Lord.

The Lucenarium which opens the service is an of evening prayer. It is solemn ancient form thanksgiving for the light of Christ. This blessing which is sung over the Christ candle is taken from the Didache, circa 95 A.D., and establishes the centrality of Christ in the rest of the service as the Christ candle remains throughout. The candles are lit at this time. During the course of the service they are extinguished. The gradual darkening of the sanctuary gives Tenebrae its particular character and tone as the complementary vigil to Holy During the Easter Vigil one light sets everything alight; at Tenebrae there is gradual darkness and silence, until the end, when only the Christ candle remains in silence.

The three nocturnes of the Roman lectionary amplify this Christological meditation. Christ is seen as the one who weeps over Jerusalem (the Lamentations of Jeremiah); the hoped for fulfillment of the psalmist (St. Augustine); the true sacrifice of a broken and contrite heart (Ps. 51); and the true and eternal High Priest (Letter to the Hebrews). The Old Testament finds its meaning in the Paschal sacrifice of Christ.

Ancient sources were used for the lectionary, the psalm prayers and the responsories. This was done in order that the history of the Church's prayer becomes our prayer, and that we may be enriched by our inheritance of faith and life in the Roman tradition.
