PENTECOST SUNDAY

MAY 24, 2015

On the evening of that first day of the week, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst. John 10: 19-23

They are together in one place. Over their months together, they have gone from being strangers to acquaintances, soon becoming friends and now brothers. There were many tense moments and infighting; they saw things that stunned them, exhilarated them, terrified them. Then came the events of the past seven weeks. The conventional wisdom would be to run as far as they could, especially from one another. Because of their association with Him, they are marked men. Go - get away from here! But they are still together, united in their astonishment at His reappearance, in their humiliation of abandoning Him, at their fear of not knowing what was to happen next. His peace has taken hold of them; they have enough hope to stay together, enough faith to take on the next chapter of the story. And then comes the moment of awareness. They hear something within them - both as individuals and as a group that put the pieces together, that focuses their resolve, that compels them to act. The Spirit of God. Another time, another place, another gathering: us. We gather together despite our doubts and questions, our struggles and disappointments. We come together despite the world telling us that there are better things to do today. But we have seen Him in the moments of compassion and forgiveness we have experienced. We have been grasped by His hand when we have slipped and fallen. We have known His peace in the storms of our lives. So, we gather as they did that first Pentecost to pray, to listen, to bless and break bread in His memory, to resolve to take on the next chapter of the story. *Pentecost again!*

The picture of that first Pentecost is the picture of every Christian community since - including our own. And, as that first gathering of Jesus' friends experienced His Spirit in wind and fire, that same Spirit speaks to us. So what is the Spirit calling us, as a Church and as individuals, to do the Pentecost of the year 2015: to forgive? - to heal? - to lift up? - to welcome? The miracle of Pentecost is re-created every time the Church gathers. What happened to those terrified first disciples happens to us. What began with them continues with us. Once again, the Spirit speaks to us, as individuals and as a community, to bring His word to life.


