One of the synagogue officials, named Jairus, came forward. Seeing Jesus, he fell at his feet and pleaded earnestly with him, saying, "My daughter is at the point of death. Please come, lay your hands on her that she may get well and live." There was a woman afflicted with hemorrhage for twelve years. "If I but touch his clothes, I shall be cured." Mark 5: 21-43

Life can be so much easier and peaceful when we have nothing to do with others. Don't get involved, walk away, mind your own business - are much safer approaches to life. But in today's Gospel, Jesus is not afraid to wade into the messiness in order to transform, heal and restore. In the two miracles we hear today, Jesus ignores custom and taboo in a way that modern readers may miss - in taking the dead girl by the hand, in allowing the sick woman to touch him. Jesus became ceremoniously unclean and not permitted to enter the synagogue or temple; but to respond compassionately to the plight of these families becomes more important, more sacred than the "safety" of convention and tradition. May we imitate that same compassion of the healing Christ, risking our own sense of safety and satisfaction in order to bring that love into the lives of others.


