Bartimaeus, a blind man, the son of Timaeus, sat by the road side begging. "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me...! Master, I want to see." Mark 10: 46-52

# Master, I Want to See

Periodically, we need to hear a Gospel like today's. We need to enter into it. We need to identify with Bartimaeus, begging on the side of the road. We need to sense that Jesus is passing by in this mass, in this assembly of yearners and believers. The truth is, if we will admit it, that in some areas of the heart, in some areas of the spirit, like the apostles in Mark, we have misunderstood Jesus and His message, that we have spiritual blind spots. But Jesus, in this liturgy, is calling us. "What do you want me to do for you?" He asks. Right away we can think of a million things, but surely, a more true, a more reflective response should be that of Bartimaeus, "Lord, I want to see."

In today's Gospel, a blind man asks to see. Jesus responds, in this story from Mark's Gospel, not by mixing mud or touching the man's eyes or looking to heaven in prayer; Jesus says, basically, "look with the eyes of the faith you already possess." Bartimaeus received his physical sight - but Jesus also affirms the vision that he already possessed by faith - to realize God's compassion in his midst, to see the possibilities for transforming hope and recreating love to heal the brokenness in his life, to comprehend God's call to be the means for justice and reconciliation in His kingdom. Jesus opens the eyes of our hearts as well, enabling us to see our lives and our world with a vision of faith - to realize the opportunities to bring life and light, healing and peace along our way to the dwelling place of God.

As He restores not only physical sight but a sense of the reality of God's love to Bartimaeus, Christ comes to restore our "sight" to see God's sacred presence in our own lives, to heal us of our blindness to the sins of selfishness and hatred, we too, easily rationalize away. Faith is to see with the human heart, to perceive in the spirit, to comprehend in the wisdom of God.
