### God's Footprint

Before creation, our own sense of entitled honor fades; caught up in the love of God, our sense of self diminishes. Humility is to recognize the "footprint" of God in our midst; such as Jesus-like humility is the heart of discipleship. The Kingdom of God is realized only in our embracing Christ's spirit of humble servanthood - servanthood that finds fulfillment in the love, compassion and kindness we can extend to others, servanthood that puts the common good before self-interest and profit, servanthood that compels us to place the needs of others less fortunate than ourselves above our own wants and narrow interests. The faithful disciple of Jesus honors the dignity of the servant over the power of the rich, canonizes generous humility over cynical celebrity, and finds inspiration in the total generosity of the widow rather than the empty gestures of the scribe. May we seek to lead and follow in the spirit of Jesus, to reveal the "footprint" of God's compassion in our own seeking of reconciliation rather than vengeance, justice rather than convention, selflessness rather than self-interest.
