

### About Saint Clement of Rome

Pope Clement I, also known as Saint Clement of Rome, served the early Christian Church during the 1st century AD. According to Tertulian, Pope Clement was consecrated by Saint Peter and was a leading member of the early church in Rome. He is known to have written one epistle to the church in Corinth dated ca. 96 AD, which established the hierarchy of bishops and presbyters as leaders of the Church.

In approximately 100 AD, Saint Clement I was banished to a work camp off the coast of the Crimean Sea (modern Ukraine). When he arrived at the camp, he was so successful in converting the laboring pagans that he was punished by being tied to an anchor and thrown off of a ship into the Crimea. In 869, Saint Cyril brought what he believed to be the relics of Saint Clement to Rome. They are currently housed in the Basilica of Saint Clement in Rome.

## Dates of Interest

April 1922 Saint Clement Parish was established and

Msgr. Joseph J. Schmit was appointed as the

founding Pastor.

June 1922 Property was purchased at the corner of

Madison and Lincoln Avenues to serve as

the location of the new parish.

December 1922 The first Mass was held in the church

basement on Christmas Day.

April 1923 The first Mass was held in the upper church

building on Easter Day.

May 1923 57 children received their First Holy

Communion.

September 1923 The new church was blessed.

November 1924 The new school was blessed; 350 children

were in attendance for the first day of school. The Sisters of Saint Joseph staffed

the school until 1992.

April 1925 The organ was dedicated during a concert of

sacred music.

September 1927 Eight new classrooms and a gymnasium

were added. The rectory was also enlarged

to accommodate two more assistants.

March 1942 The organ was rebuilt at a cost of \$3,500.
