

My experiences of the 10th National Eucharistic Congress

From July 17-21, nearly 55,000 Catholics from across the country descended upon Indianapolis for the 10th National Eucharistic Congress, the first one in over 80 years. I and nearly 200 other individuals from the Diocese of Cleveland were chosen to be a part of our diocesan delegation. Leading up to this event, I was a little hesitant. I was going to be leaving home for five days, leaving my dog behind, missing the comfort of my own bed at night, and somewhat dreading the idea of "this will just be another one of those typical boring conferences." Yet, on Night One, with a packed Lucas Oil Stadium, the first thing was not praise and worship, dynamic speakers, or an elaborate welcome. The first thing was Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. In a darkened stadium, 55,000 Catholics knelt in reverence and awe of Our Lord, who gave the gift of Himself to the world. It was a truly powerful experience that would be a focal point for each night of the Congress.

As the congress continued, each day was filled with sessions and speakers about the Eucharist and our encounter with Christ - all meant to prepare us to be sent back into our communities to share the Good News. Out of all the sessions and speakers, I think there were three main takeaways that I have kept with me. The first: Often it seems that the more we experience something, the more ordinary it can become. While I have always known, and held dearly, the great mystery of the Eucharist, I had let it become a routine facet of my life. I had simplified the Great Encounter of Our Lord in the Eucharist, at each Mass, to something...ordinary. There is truly nothing ordinary about the Eucharist. God takes the ordinary simple things of bread and wine and transforms them into nothing less than the gift of Himself. The ordinary becomes truly extraordinary. The second: Christ wants to have a relationship with everyone. While we receive that gift particularly in Holy Communion, the gift is not for us alone. It is meant to be shared. While I don't have all the answers for the best way to share the gift of Christ, it has caused me to be more reflective about how I ought to share the gift of Christ with all those I meet. The third: Our Church is truly a family. Despite the crowds of tens of thousands of people, I frequently would run into someone I knew, or hadn't seen in years. It was comforting to know that even though separated by hundreds or thousands of miles, we are all connected in faith. That is something I will always treasure.

While this short little article by no means encapsulates the fullness of my experience at the Eucharistic Congress, one thing is absolutely true. Christ is working. He is not idle. He is on the move and wants to set each of our hearts ablaze with the fire of His love. Are we willing to accept it? I think we are.

PSR and Sacramental Preparation 2024-2025

We are happy to offer several faith formation options for the Lakewood Catholic community. Families with children in public school, or non-Catholic schools are invited to consider one of the following faith formation options. Parish School of Religion programs follow the school year calendar, beginning in late August / early September and meeting through early May.

Parish School of Religion: Families will have three options to choose from:

Option 1 – Family PSR - Parish School of Religion: Families with children in grades 1 – 8 will complete the Pflaum Gospel Weekly lessons at home with their children and have quarterly in-person check-ins. The check-ins will take place at Saint Clement Church. In addition, families enrolled in Family PSR will gather with other PSR families several times throughout the year for fellowship and formation activities. Families who choose this option are asked to attend a parent meeting on Monday, September 9 at Saint Clement Church Hall, 6:30 pm – 8:00 pm.

Option 2 – Catechesis of the Good Shepherd: Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is a Montessori inspired approach to the religious formation of children, rooted in Sacred Scripture, Liturgy and respect for the child's rich relationship with God. The children gather in a specially prepared space called an Atrium. A typical session includes prayer, a presentation on scripture or liturgy, and time for the children to work with the prepared materials and quietly ponder the mysteries presented. The Level I Atrium is prepared for children ages 3 – 6 year old (K). The Level II Atrium is prepared for children ages 6 – 9, 1st grade – 3rd grade. Level 1 and Level 2 meet on Wednesday evenings 6:30 pm – 8:00 pm at the Saint James Parish Center. Here is link to a short video further explaining the beauty of Catechesis of the Good Shepherd. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=hfg9RfBk-fY In addition, families enrolled in Catechesis of the Good Shepherd will gather with other PSR families several times throughout the year for fellowship and formation activities. A Parent Meeting for parents new to CGS will be held Wednesday, August 28 at Saint James Parish Center, 6:30 pm – 8:00 pm. Students new to CGS begin September 4, returning students begin September 25.

Option 3 – Classroom PSR Model for students in grades 1- 8, students meet in classrooms with catechists. Students study the Sophia Institute program *Spirit of Truth*. This option takes place at the Saint Luke school building, Mondays 6:30 pm - 7:30 pm. In addition, families enrolled in the Classroom Model will gather with other PSR families several times throughout the year for fellowship and formation activities. Classroom PSR begins Monday, September 16 at Saint Luke School Building. 6:30 pm - 7:30 pm.

Sacramental Preparation: First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion, Confirmation

Preparation for the Sacrament of First Reconciliation, First Holy Communion and Confirmation is in addition to PSR attendance and Catholic school. Students from all three parishes will prepare together for the Sacraments.

Preparation for Reconciliation and First Communion traditionally begins when students are in their 2nd grade year.

Preparation for Confirmation traditionally begins in the 7th grade and continues through the 8th grade year.

A Parent Meeting for parents of children preparing for First Reconciliation will be held on Thursday, September 19 at Saint Luke at 6:30 pm.


