

As we approach the end of the liturgical year, our readings this Sunday turn our minds to the final things: the end of time, the coming of Christ, and our ultimate hope in eternal life. In the Gospel, Jesus speaks of days of darkness and tribulation, of the heavens shaken and the world awaiting the Son of Man coming in power. It's a powerful, even unsettling image—a reminder that our lives and our world are finite, and that the Lord will come to judge both the living and the dead.

Jesus's words remind us that life is fragile and temporary, but they're not a call to fear. Rather, they're a call to vigilance, to live in hopeful expectation of His coming. He invites us to live with our hearts open to God, attentive to His presence in the here and now. Even in the face of hardship, turmoil, or uncertainty, He urges us not to lose heart but to cling to the hope of His promise.

In the reading from Daniel, we hear that those who are wise will shine like the brightness of the stars. This wisdom comes from a life lived in God's presence—a life that reflects God's love, peace, and justice. The wise are those who recognize the signs of God's Kingdom already breaking into our world. They live not for themselves but for others, shining like stars in their love and service to their neighbors.

The reading from Hebrews reminds us that Christ's sacrifice on the cross has opened the way for our salvation. Unlike the old sacrifices that needed to be repeated, Christ's offering is once and for all. His sacrifice brings us a peace that cannot be shaken and an assurance that God's mercy will triumph in the end.

So, as we meditate on these readings, let's ask ourselves:

- How can I live in a way that prepares my heart to meet Christ, in this life and the next?
- Am I living with a sense of hope and vigilance, trusting in His promise of eternal life?
- · Am I shining with God's light, bringing hope and peace to those around me?

Let us bring these questions to prayer this week, asking God for the grace to live with hope, love, and courage, trusting that He is with us, leading us through every season and every challenge, until we are gathered to Him in the fullness of time. May we keep our eyes fixed on the horizon, living each day in the light of eternity.

Best Recipes for Thanksgiving A Simple Potato Soup

As you may have guessed, I'm really trying to go all out for Thanksgiving this year. While none of these recipes I present to you are "out of this world" I hope they may add a something a little different to make this the best Thanksgiving yet. So for your consideration, a recipe I'll definitely be using for one of my Thanksgiving courses, I offer you a recipe for Potato Soup.

Ingredients:

- 6 slices thin bacon, cut into 1-inch pieces
- 1 medium onion, diced
- 3 carrots, diced
- · 3 celery stalks, diced
- · 6 small russet potatoes, peeled and diced
- 1/2 teaspoon kosher salt, plus more to taste
- · Black pepper, to taste
- 1/2 teaspoon Cajun spice mix
- · 8 cups low-sodium chicken or vegetable broth
- 3 tablespoons all-purpose flour
- 1 cup milk
- 1/2 cup heavy cream
- · 1 teaspoon minced fresh parsley, plus extra for garnish
- 1 cup grated cheese of your choice

Instructions:

- 1. Cook the Bacon: In a soup pot over medium heat, add the bacon pieces and cook until they're crisp and the fat has rendered. Remove the bacon with a slotted spoon and set aside. Pour off most of the grease, but leave a little in the pot for flavor.
- 2. Sauté the Vegetables: Return the pot to medium-high heat and add the onion, carrot, and celery. Stir and cook for about 2 minutes, then add the diced potatoes. Cook for an additional 5 minutes, seasoning with salt, pepper, and Cajun spice.
- 3. Add Broth and Simmer: Pour in the broth and bring the soup to a gentle boil. Let it cook for about 10 minutes, or until the potatoes are starting to become tender. In a separate bowl, whisk together the flour and milk until smooth, then pour this mixture into the soup, stirring well. Allow the soup to cook for another 5 minutes.
- 4. Blend Part of the Soup: Carefully remove half to two-thirds of the soup and blend it in batches in a blender or food processor until completely smooth. Return the blended portion to the pot and stir to combine. Reheat the soup over low heat, tasting and adjusting seasonings as needed.
- 5. Finish with Cream and Parsley: Stir in the heavy cream and most of the minced parsley, reserving a little parsley for garnish.
- 6. Serve: Ladle the soup into bowls, and top with the reserved crispy bacon, a sprinkle of grated cheese, and a garnish of fresh parsley.


